Report of the Vice-President – Karen Schroeder reminded members to respond to their emails for meals and if you are attending.

Recording Secretary - The minutes of the April Business and Program meetings were approved as presented.

Volunteers are needed to take the birthday gifts to the Royal Family Kids Camp on June 15th. T-shirts for the softball teams will have the new Pilot logo on them. Hanging baskets were given to Meadowlark, Via Christie, Stoneybrook and the Hospice House. Phyllis Allerheiligen reported that Bonnie Nespor was to receive a special award at Meadowlark.

Old Business – At district convention it was voted on to increase the District Dues from \$11.00 to \$15.00. PI dues \$65.00, Insurance \$6.00, Club dues \$8.00, making a total of \$94.00. There is a one time initiation fee of \$25.00 for new members. The proposed wording of the standing rules were changed as suggested. In standing rule 6 and 8 the word WILL was changed to MAY.

- Design Zone, May 27-August 6, Visitors can go behind the scenes and see how video game developers, music producers, roller coaster designers and other creative problem solvers use math to do the amazing things they do. Design Zone explores mathematical concepts like patterns, variable, scale, slope and ratios used by artists, architects, engineers, musicians, and other innovators.

- Brain Teasers, May 27-August 6, This exhibit, produced and toured by the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry, offers 21 challenges for puzzle enthusiasts of all ages. The exhibit is designed to sharpen problem-solving skills and provide plenty of fun. Brain twisters include unraveling mathematical conundrums, separating linked objects and then reassembling them, arranging geometric shapes to form new ones, and much more. To solve these puzzles, visitors must use creative thinking and problem solving strategies such as looking for patterns, thinking ahead, setting aside preconceived ideas, and looking at problems from different perspectives.
