The exhibit is designed to sharpen problem-solving skills and provide plenty of fun. 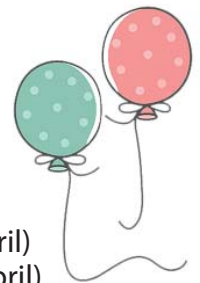
